

We live (a) an amazing planet make up of mountains, oceans, countries and *continents. (1) a / 2) good / 3) need / 4) our / 5) to / 6) understand / 7) way / (8) we / (9) world,) to *depict it. Since the world is round, the most *accurate way is with a *globe. (b), people have traditionally used maps, even though a flat map can't accurately *represent a round planet. Why is this so?

The first reason is [A]. Globes are expensive, and maps are cheap. A good globe may cost ¥10,000. A world map is bought (c) ¥1,000, 10% the price.

The second reason is convenience. It is easy to use [B], but it is difficult to carry [C]. Why? Because you can easily *fold a map and put it in your pocket.

The third reason is *visibility. A world map shows all seven continents. A globe shows only half the planet. If you're looking at Asia, you can't see North America because it's on the (d) side.

The fourth reason is that maps can show *detailed information. We can easily get city maps, *neighborhood maps and even campus maps. This level of *detail is impossible with globes. If someone says, "Show me Shinjuku Station on this globe," there's no way vou can do it!

(e) a globe is the best way to represent our planet, people use maps because they are cheaper, more convenient, have good visibility and show more detail. And now, paper maps are *gradually changed to (f) maps on cellphones!
